Spirituality Sunday 5th December 2021 2nd Sunday of Advent

During this week's Sing and Praise and Hymn Practice, the children listened to an Advent message from Archbishop John Wilson. He told us that Advent is a Latin word which means 'coming' and this Advent season is a time for us to prepare our hearts for the coming of Jesus at Christmas.

An excellent way of preparing our hearts is to listen to and reflect upon the Scriptures. At the Junior School pupils have the opportunity during Advent to join with Mrs. Norbury and the Y6 Chaplaincy Team for lunchtime times of *Lectio Divina* which, in English, means Holy Reading. This form of praying has been used throughout the centuries and is a wonderfully simple way of being with the Lord - a space in which we listen to His Word in our lives. 
