Ventilation in School

Following a number of enquiries, we thought it would be helpful to include some information in today's newsletter. Management continue to monitor this across each school whilst giving you a reassurance that the school heating is working effectively in each school.

Risk assessments continue to be in place regarding ventilation and this follows what should be normal day practise for clean air circulation although we are more aware of this during the current time. The expectations are that good ventilation is vital on a day to day basis in all rooms. Obviously the temperature varies throughout the day depending on the room being full of people or left empty during break times.

We have children who don't like to feel very hot and take their jumpers off in class and those who prefer to be warmer so it is a bit of a task to accommodate all. If your child reports that they sometimes feel cold, then we ask that you provide another under layer e.g. a vest or appropriate T shirt. We also have an issue from day to day with children not wanting to wear coats outside for playtime and at the end of the day.

We also ask you to provide warm accessories of hats and gloves that form part of the expected school uniform to support them being warm at times when they have outdoor activities. We do need to remind parents that outdoor activities continue in line with the daily delivery of the school curriculum. Hopefully this has reassured you and answered some queries.

Home School Agreements

These will be sent home with your child today, in their bookbags/bags, to be completed by both pupils and parents. These need be returned to school by Friday 11th December. This document confirms that parents agree to abide by all school policies. On the flip side - the class that manages to get a complete signed set first will be rewarded with extra playtime as a reward.
