Dear Parents and Carers,

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Coming to the end of our second week in school has brought a further realisation that life in our current world is still very stressful, strange and sometimes makes us have feelings of unfairness. This week has also brought more reminders about the sadness of the whole COVID situation; more people losing loved ones and many without notice or time to prepare.

It is a reminder that we need to live each day knowing that God loves us and that he wants us to follow his Gospel values of sharing Christianity to our brothers and sisters. Thank you to the parents who offer an appreciative word in passing or by email, making all the difference to our staff who are in school daily, providing a good education to our children whilst sometimes dealing with situations themselves, perhaps having families who are suffering.

On behalf of Mrs Hulme and the school governors, we ask you to keep the staff in your thoughts and prayers as we do for you too.

As indicated in earlier correspondence, we continue to review the learning platform and provision. We will be making amendments to the home learning information post next week. Yr 4 will be trialling a whole year group virtual catch up next Wednesday afternoon. This will take the form of children logging on from home to join in with a reflection and prayer. We are trialling this to see how families manage with the logging on from their variations of devices. It is timed to avoid any clashes with high school registration of a morning- bear with us please as it is a trial.

We will also be making amendments to the response system for Google Classroom. Previously we have said that a reply would be posted within 24 hours. Due to the high demand of parents needing contact we will endeavour to respond within 48 hours effective from today. We must emphasise the high expectations of teachers in the quality and quantity of planning and delivery of lessons in addition to making individual phone calls home and online responses to individuals is a huge demand within a school day. We ask that you please refer first to updated communication on the Learning Grids as we value your ongoing help and support.

Thank you. We still have a number of staff seriously unwell and those who have families unwell. We will continue to inform you if this impacts on certain year groups. More importantly, we must all join our prayers in asking our dear Lord to end the misery of this dreadful pandemic. Please continue to keep us informed of family circumstances that may affect our children emotionally and impact on their learning.

This Sunday is Peace Sunday


