There was much excitement as teachers passed the box around for pupils to pick out a winning envelope.





At the Junior School the Y6 Chaplaincy Team have been busy for the past few weeks: promoting the appeal, sorting out the envelopes and making sure the chocolate was correctly labelled. One of the pupils' posters was so good that Pact used it to publicise the appeal nationally. Andy Keen -Downs, Pact's Chief Executive Officer, was very impressed!

Undaunted, the Chaplaincy Team worked brilliantly - picking out the envelopes, selecting the winning chocolate, attaching the envelope to the prize and then taking it to the winner's class. All the money raised will be converted into £10 gift cards which, thanks to your generosity, means that 101 prisoners in HMP Downview will now be able to give a gift card to their children for Christmas.

Thank you everyone for your generous support.




What a thoughtful act Isabelle, well done.
