## <u>Catholic News Round Up</u>

### Christians and Muslims: it is God who is binding us together, and the meeting between us is God's gift.

Last week, Ramadan began for our Muslim brothers and sisters. In a whole school assembly, the children found out about what this means. Ramadan is the fourth of the 'five pillars' of Islam, the five requirements of being a Muslim. Ramadan is marked by a fast, which lasts for a month. It is the time when Muslims believe their holy book, the Quran, was revealed to them by the Prophet Muhammad (Peace Be Upon Him). Feeling hungry and thirsty helps Muslims to understand what it is like for people in the world who do not have enough to eat or drink all the time. They set aside money to give to the poor.



#### Lenten Mass at the Infant School

This week we welcomed Fr Anthony from St Margaret's of Scotland parish in Carshalton Beeches. As we move closer to Holy Week this mass was a time for reflection during the season of Lent. We thank the pupils for their enthusiastic singing and the children from Year 2 who were involved in playing percussion instruments. Pupils were also participating in serving, reading and the offertory procession, as well as Fr Anthony involving them in his homily. We thank Fr Anthony for taking the time to come into school during the Lenten season and hope to welcome him again in the near future.



Year 5 walked to Holy Cross for Mass this week. Our previous RE topic was about the memorial sacrifice of Jesus and so the Eucharist felt particularly special this time. Mr Patrick played the piano and the children sang and joined in with the Mass responses really well. We thank the families who were able to walk with us and those who joined us there.

We noticed when we arrived at the Church that the statues and images were veiled in purple. As soon as we see this, we know we are now in Passiontide, with Palm Sunday this weekend, and Holy Week the week next week. In his Passion, Jesus' face and whole body were so disfigured and unrecognisable. For this reason, we veil the crosses in the final days of Lent, hiding our Lord and Saviour under the purple cloth. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil. Palm Sunday is Lent's sixth and last Sunday and marks the beginning of Holy Week. Year 5 have been rehearsing a retelling of Christ's Passion and are looking forward to sharing it, outdoors, we hope, on Wednesday.


