



General Data Protection Regulations (UK GDPR)

On the 25th May 2018, new regulations were introduced which affected how our schools handle people's data, called the General Data Protection Regulation. The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) is a piece of EU-wide legislation which determines how people's personal data is processed and kept safe, and the legal rights individuals have in relation to their own data.

Following the UK's exit from the EU at the end of 2020, EU GDPR no longer applies to the UK. However, we still need to comply with UK data protection law. The GDPR has been incorporated into UK data protection law as the UK GDPR-so in practice there is little change to the core data protection principles, rights and obligations found in the UK GDPR.

Compliance with the regulations is an ongoing process and St Mary's Catholic Federation, Carshalton has appointed a data protection officer to advise and manage compliance with the regulation. Full details of our data protection officer can be found below should you have any questions.
